#### Target Population & Services Defined:

**TAY** (Transitional Aged Youth): dependent foster youth between ages 13 and 18, receive support through....

**ILP:** (Independent Living Program) focused on preparing youth for adulthood

**NMD** (Non-Minor Dependents): former foster youth between ages 18 and 21, remain active in the CWS and receive support through....

**EFC:** (Extended Foster Care) program with case management & employment/training services.



## OBJECTIVES

- Create a Safety Net for transitioning youth and young adults.
- Help youth navigate the transition from foster care to the real world.
- Support NMDs 21+ in their continued transition to adulthood to navigate the "real world."
- Encourage strong partnerships between CWS and CalWORKs, focusing on youth in ILP (Independent Living Program) and EFC (Extended Foster Care.

# A prevention-based iteration of an earlier Linkages model



#### **Prevention Focus:**



Linkages TAY/NMD's primary focus is to ensure that these youth and young adults prevent generational trauma related to abuse and neglect, so that they will transition out of the child welfare system with:

- Supports and skills they need to create safe and stable homes of their own,
- Experience healthy, nurturing relationships, and
- Live in supported environments so they can thrive.

# Overall Goal

Improve CWS and
CalWORKs/Eligibility collaboration
to support the TAY and NMD
population in California so that....

All youth and young adults transition from foster care into adulthood with the skills & knowledge needed to access benefits and resources.

#### What can we do?

- Build upon and leverage existing supports (rather than creating new ones)
- Ensure all NMDs (not just the NMD who are also parents) access all available supports
- TAY/NMD learn about all benefits potentially available to them
- Ensure TAY/NMD know how to access/apply for benefits, such as SNAP, Medi-Cal, etc.
- Employ specialty case managers knowledgeable on all benefits, whenever possible
- Employment/benefits rep attend all CFT meetings, whenever possible
- Ensure a TAY/NMD representative attend all Linkages coordinator team meetings
