<ul> <li>Q: What are some tips and tools for cross-training staff?</li> <li>(I) Vanessa (Calaveras) shared that CW social workers were they using a screening tool to help them understand which services families were eligible for</li> <li>Lisa (Tehama) shared that cross-training was easier in Tehama due to the proximity of cross-program staff. They work in the same building so collaboration is easier.</li> <li>(I) Jill Bright (Orange County) shared that integrating Linkages training for all new staff, during New Worker training was working well for OC. They also have a refresher training for all staff annually. She also shared that co-location of Foster Care EWs with CWS social workers was a benefit as well as placing EWs in FRCs. (W) Jill will ask her Training and Career development Team if she can share out the training materials.</li> </ul>	Lisa, Tehama WTW asked the question

<ul> <li>(I) Felix Minjarez (Riverside) shared that Riverside now cross-training staff, instead of training EW, CM Welfare, WTW separately about Linkages. Now the train together (the "roadshow"). The conversation much more fruitful. Their ppts walk through polic procedures, what Linkages is, what each program is, and why Linkages is best for families. (W) Felix vishare out the ppt they use. (Danna reminded folks the video that Riverside uses in their training is featured in CFPIC's toolkit on the Linkages link on cfpic.org.</li> <li>(I) Include the WIFM (Felix) and Michele Tom (San Mateo) Danna reminded the group that there was Workshop (B1) at the Annual Convening – What's for Me and material from Orange, Riverside and Libe found at <a href="https://linkages.cfpic.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/02/Linkages-Convening-Agenda-for-web-2-22-23.pdf">https://linkages.cfpic.org/wp-content/uploads/2023/02/Linkages-Convening-Agenda-for-web-2-22-23.pdf</a></li> <li>(I) Lisa (Tehama) suggested to use champion CWS workers to tell other CWS Social workers about the benefits for families of using services available thr Cal Works—why Linkages is better for families and makes CWS advocacy for services easier. Michele Lisa shared that highlighting the benefits of Linkage helps the work seem really worthwhile versus just another thing to do in the hectic workflow.</li> <li>(I) Have a regular training schedule b/c the turnov rate is so high (Lisa)</li> </ul>	hild hey ns are ies, s role will s that s that s chat social e ough d and ges
<ul> <li>Q: Examples of collaboration?</li> <li>(I) Jill (OC) shared that their ER referrals are automatically screened to determine if the family was referred was already a mutual client (open EW/WTW/CalWORKs family) and if so, the family is referred to the regional office which co-locates FC and CWS.</li> </ul>	together so these bullets capture that conversation.

•	<ul> <li>(I) Victor Cervantez (Stanislaus) is an EW who is embedded within a CW unit. He represents WTW and Eligibility Services. He reports to both an EW Sup and a CW Sup. Victor and his colleague are each embedded within CW and co-located as well. He is always educating and training informally and said that key issues for ongoing training are screening processes, how to work with service providers, processes for CW to engage EWs.</li> <li>(I) Use regular standing meetings as opportunities for teamwork (Danna) and (W) Victor shared more about the unit meetings he has and the regular staffing of cases since he is so embedded in Stanislaus CW.</li> <li>(I) Felix (Riverside) shared that there were spaces for EW to sit at and work from in each CW office.</li> <li>(I) Vanessa (Calaveras) shared that they were thinking about how to include EWs in all intake or imminent risk CFTs</li> <li>(I) Francine Ortiz (Ventura) shared that they use a Resource Navigator who is cross-trained in all programs, and reports to a WTW Supervisor. This person goes everywhere though to ensure linkage and referrals for families.</li> </ul>
