What is Linkages?



Linkages teams are comprised of Child Welfare and Self-Sufficiency staff. They work with families who are served by CalWORKs/WTW and involved with Child Welfare or at risk of Child Welfare involvement.


They provide services and service coordination in these areas:


- Prevention
- Hotline and Emergency Response Referrals
- Family Maintenance (voluntary / non-court & court-supervised)
- Family Reunification
- Aftercare



Linkages teams work together to

- Collaborate across programs
- Coordinate and align case plans (WTW 2 Plan Activity)
- Engage with the family
- Share resources
- Address needs
- Build on the family's strengths and natural supports





PREVENTION FRAMEWORK & LINKAGES

Primary / Universal

Programs targeted at entire population to provide support and education before problems occur

 Family support info and resources for CalWORKs families

Secondary

Programs targeted at families in need to alleviate identified problems and prevent escalation

- CW Family Stabilization & Home Visiting
- CWS Differential Response
- ER/CalWORKs service coordination


Tertiary

Provide interventions for children experiencing maltreatment

 Child Welfare /CalWORKs service & case planning coordination for FM and FR

Linkages Key Ingredients



CalWORKs Family Reunification (CWFR)

Early Engagement and Eligibility Bureau




CWFR: Existing Policy

Assembly Bill (AB) 429:

- CalWORKs services are available to the parent(s) of a child(ren) removed from the home and temporarily placed in out-of-home care if the county has determined those services necessary for reunification.
- Available for up to 180 consecutive days could be extended due to good cause.
- Includes Welfare to Work (WTW) services such as mental health and substance abuse services, but not cash aid or child care.
- Temporary Homeless Assistance for FR families (AB 236)

Assembly Bill 135 & CWFR Policy Changes



Eligibility for CWFR

- All CalWORKs-eligible children were removed from the home and temporarily placed in out-of-home care.
- The family was receiving CalWORKs cash aid when the child(ren) was removed.
- CWS or a court has determined that the provision of cash aid, child care, and/or reunification services is necessary for reunification, and a reunification plan is in development and/or in effect.




Initial Temporary Absence Period

When all CalWORKs eligible children are removed from the home by the CWS agency:

- 1. The children will be considered temporary absent for one full month. The family will not be discontinued.
- 2. The CWS agency should provide a notification to the HHSA on whether CWFR will be recommended before the end of the initial temporary absence period.
- 3. If the family is recommended for CWFR, the HHSA will transition the family to CWFR after temporary absence period has ended.
- 4. If HHSA receives notification that there will not be a recommendation for CWFR or does not receive a notification, then the family is discontinued from CalWORKs.


Initial Temporary Absence Period - Visual



Process Map for CWFR Cash Aid

Scenario Information

- CW Family Composition: 3 (1 Parent + 2 Children)
- Current Aid Code: 30
- RD Due: August 2025



CWFR: Prominent Q&As

1. Do the CalWORKs reporting rules apply for CWFR?

Yes. Since the CWFR family is receiving cash aid, all CalWORKs rules tied to the cash aid apply including:

- SAR 7, Redetermination, & mid-period reporting rules
- CalWORKs time-on-aid clocks will tick
- Overpayments can be established
- 2. Can CalWORKs cash aid be extended beyond six months for CWFR? Not at this time. CWFR cash aid can only be provided for up to six months. CWFR services can be extended if there is good cause.

CWFR: Prominent Q&As

3. <u>Is CalWORKs cash aid for CWFR families a once-in-a-lifetime policy?</u>

Families can receive six months of CWFR cash aid per FR plan, and it is not limited to once-in-a-lifetime. However, a family cannot receive more than six months of cash aid in one CWFR plan.

4. Are families with CalWORKs penalties and WTW sanctions eligible for CWFR?

Yes. Families with existing penalties and sanctions are eligible for CWFR. However, the penalties and sanctions must remain on the grant until they are addressed by the family.

CWFR: Prominent Q&As

5. Can the children in the CWFR parent(s)' AU be aided in another CalWORKs case?

Not at this time. Since the needs of the child are included in the CWFR parent(s)' AU, they cannot be aided in another CalWORKs AU. If the CWFR child(ren) is placed in the care of a relative or a parent, the relative or parent can apply and, if eligible, receive aid for themselves as an AU of one.

6. Are the CWFR child(ren) eligible for Foster Care?

Yes. CWFR child(ren) will be eligible for AFDC-FC, the alternative relative caregiver (ARC) program, and family maintenance assistance payments while in their parent(s)' CalWORKs case.

CWFR Services (1)

Good Cause Extension

CWS may recommend a good cause extension to the six-month temporary absence period for continued WTW services.

When the CWS determines that additional time is needed to reunify the family, they may recommend Good Cause in up to six-month intervals.

CWDs must then determine that the family is still CalWORKs financially eligible based on information in the case file.

CWFR Services (2)

WTW Participation Sanctions & FR

CWDs who utilize the CWS FR case plan, rather than the WTW 2, must exempt CWFR parents from the WTW noncompliance process, *including imposing a sanction*.

CWDs who utilize the WTW 2 and later impose a sanction on CWFR parents must continue to offer WTW services included in the CWS FR case plan.

Under AB 429 and AB 135, CWFR parents who are sanctioned and not receiving cash aid, maintain eligibility to WTW services. CWDs may use the FR case plan in lieu of a WTW plan.

Under AB 135, CWFR parents must participate in WTW unless exempt.

CWS FR Case Plan vs. WTW Plan

CWS FR Case Plan

- Families will not be subject to WTW noncompliance rules and risk financial sanctions.
- Minimizes conflicting requirements between WTW, child welfare, and families.
- Recognizes balancing work, training, and responsibilities can be challenging.

WTW Plan

- Must be used when providing additional activities and services not included in the case plan (i.e., education).
- Eases transition to WTW postreunification.

WTW Activities & Supportive Services

Not available to CWFR Families:

- Job Retention
- Post-Aid Services
- Diaper Allowance

Welfare and Institutions Code 16501.1

Reasonable services, or active efforts, in the case of an Indian child, for family reunification must be documented unless the juvenile court determines otherwise.


CWS Case Plan Requirements

Division 31-206 to 225 Requirements


- The case plan goal
- Any changes in the case plan
 - Treatment services
 - Treatment providers
 - Changes in placement
- A description of the parent/guardian compliance with the written case plan
- Cooperation in keeping appointments

Update CWS Case Plan in CWS/CMS



Family Reunification Best Practices

- Share the case plan with the CalWORKs worker as soon as possible to ensure timely transition to cash aid and services.
- Assess the family strengths, needs and goals regarding services needed to begin CalWORKs FR.
- Coordinate services and resources with the CalWORKs partners to reduce stress and eliminate contradicting plans and goals.
- Team with the CalWORKs worker to monitor the case plan to achieve reunification and identify any extra barriers.
- Partner with CDSS and CFSD for technical assistance and resources.
- Partner with CFPIC For implementation resources.
