A Father's Road from Addiction to Redemption: A Linkages Success Story in Riverside County

In a powerful testament to the effectiveness of Riverside County's collaborative approach to social services, one Linkages participant has emerged from the depths of crisis to achieve lasting stability—thanks to a network of support and his own commitment to change.

A Critical Turning Point

Referred by the Children's Services Division (CSD) following an investigation, this father faced a daunting array of challenges: mental health concerns, substance abuse, domestic violence, lack of childcare, and homelessness. Initially resistant to outreach efforts, he chose to comply only after persistent, compassionate contact from CSD staff—triggering the submission of a Family Reunification (FR) case. What followed was a journey marked by resilience and transformation.

The Power of Partnership

Once enrolled in services, the father received targeted support through Riverside County's unique partnership between the CSD and Self-Sufficiency Division (SSD). He began engaging in life-changing activities, including:

- Substance abuse treatment
- Random drug testing
- Pursuit of employment

This holistic support paved the way to reunification and personal renewal.

Compassionate Staff, Meaningful Change

This father's success is a direct reflection of the dedication and empathy shown by Riverside County staff. One pivotal moment

came when the father openly admitted his addiction and probable failure of a drug test. Instead of responding with judgment, the CSD supervisor assured him, "I can work with you." This honest exchange became a cornerstone of trust.

Crucially, the father wasn't alone in wanting change—staff wanted it for him. They rallied together to provide access to Child Welfare/CalWORKs (CW/CF) services and supportive programs through Welfare-to-Work (WTW), aligning resources to meet every requirement of his case plan, and seeing him as a whole person in need.

Stability Achieved

Once employed and stable, the father received further assistance through Family Stabilization Services (FSS), including housing and temporary rental subsidies. His timeline toward transformation unfolded as follows:

After nearly 21 months, this father stepped forward and declared he no longer needed public assistance - a powerful indicator of his newfound self-sufficiency.

The Bigger Picture

The Linkages program thrives when the right people are in the right roles, and Riverside County's teams exemplify this. Through patience, empathy, and consistent collaboration, they helped restore dignity, stability, and hope for a father who simply wanted to be part of his child's life. His story stands as a reminder: when determination meets support, success is possible.

Based on the feedback I received from the participant, his success can be attributed to the empathy and understanding that he received by our department. I'm pleased to say that the sincere care and concern we showed helped him transform his perception of DPSS in a positive way. Ultimately, his willingness to change, combined with the services provided by Linkages, contributed to the success of the entire family.



PAST EVENTS

CalWORKs and ER webinar

On August 20, 2025, 136 participants joined a statewide webinar focused on strengthening coordination between CalWORKs and Child Welfare Emergency Response (ER). The session provided a foundational overview of both systems, exploring how they intersect and why the Linkages framework is essential for supporting families at critical moments.



Participants examined opportunities for collaboration at the Hotline and ER levels, identifying practical strategies for improving service delivery and reducing system involvement. Humboldt and Placer Counties shared real-world examples of how they've implemented Linkages to better serve families in crisis—highlighting cross-agency teamwork, trauma-informed practices, and coordinated case management.

The session concluded with an introduction to the CalWORKs and Emergency Response Curriculum, now available on the **CFPIC Linkages website**. This resource offers training and tools to help counties build stronger, more responsive systems of care.

92.% of survey respondents reported that the webinar **provided new/helpful information** about implementing CalWORKs and ER Coordination within their county.

97% stated that they were **confident that they can now apply what they learned** to better support the strategies in their county.

Peer Sharing Call

Following our August webinar, we hosted a dynamic Peer Sharing Call on September 25th focused on the pillars of Coordination, Collaboration, and Communication. This 75-minute session brought together professionals from across the state for meaningful breakout discussions, where attendees exchanged successes, identified barriers, asked questions, and learned from one another. These peer-to-peer conversations continue to be among the most valuable aspects of our work.

We were thrilled to see strong engagement: 115 participants registered, with 66 joining live from 28 counties, representing all four regions.

During the session, counties shared innovative coordination strategies, including:

- Using a shared referral form that follows families from Child Welfare to CalWORKs/Welfare-to-Work from initial referral through closure.
- Communicating through shared email inboxes and Teams channels to streamline updates.
- Inviting Linkages staff to Child and Family Team (CFT) meetings or co-locating staff to foster real-time collaboration.

These practices reflect the growing commitment to integrated service delivery and the power of connection across systems. **94%** of attendees stated that the webinar p**rovided new helpful information** related to enhancing Linkages Coordinated Case Planning within their county, and that what they learned would allow them to better support their Linkages Work as a whole. COMMITTEE UPDATES

PEI

CFPIC is excited to launch a Pilot for the Family Needs Screening Tool, a tool developed with the Linkages Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) Committee. This tool helps self-sufficiency offices quickly identify family needs for those applying for benefits and connect them to local resources. Placer and Napa Counties will join the

pilot this Fall 2025 and we are looking for more counties to join us. After reviewing the results of the pilot, CFPIC, pilot counties, and the Linkages PEI Committee will share a findings report to guide how other counties might be able to implement the tool to support families.
